#### (7) Lacrosse

played lacrosse were Canada's aboriginals. They played it to honour the "Great Spirit", to thank their god. Later lots of immigrants learned about the game and played it for fun. Soon it was so popular that it became Canada's official sport in 1859. There are four types: field, women's field, box and Inter-Crosse.


